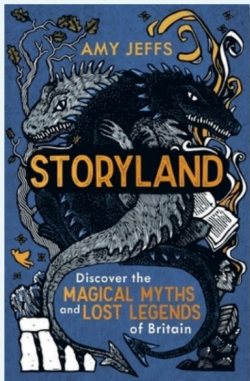

TIME TO TALK

- 4 Discuss the theme of heroism in "Storyland." How do the heroes and heroines in the book compare to modern-day heroes?
- 5 Many myths have a moral lesson. Pick one story from "Storyland" and explain the moral you believe it teaches.
- 6 If you had the power to bring one of the mythical creatures to life, which one would you choose and what would be its role in today's world?
- 7 "Storyland" includes various myths from across Britain. Which region's mythology interests you the most and why?
- 8 The book features both well-known and lesser-known myths. Discuss the importance of preserving and sharing folklore and legends with future generations.
